

# Mission imPossible A Monthly Update on the preparations for the Parish Misson: 6<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> October 2024

Meet a Missionary: Sister Michela from the Sisters Minor of St Francis

1. Can you begin by explaining why we have a specific Mission Prayer – drafted principally by Father Thé?

Every time Jesus had to make an important decision, He withdrew to pray. We ask: wasn't it enough for Him just to ask the Father to bless His intentions? We are following His example of sustained prayer.

2. Why have we been praying the Mission Prayer so far in advance of the actual mission?

All the Mission preparations began well in advance. The reason is simple: without the help of the Holy Spirit, every human plan comes to nothing. We need the Holy Spirit's guidance and direction in our planning, to open our hearts, and to prepare the hearts of those we will reach out to during the mission.

3. Can you help us understand the language of the Mission Prayer?

The Mission prayer is divided into three parts: (1) We recall the Mystery of Jesus' Incarnation, which continues to take place today, within us. (2) Life's challenges can sometimes make us feel like "a field of dead bones", "a strong headed people", or "detached branches". However, nothing can obscure God's plan forever. By welcoming Jesus and His Spirit into our lives, we can restart our journey of faith. (3) Finally, we present some specific prayer intentions to God for gifts we often lose sight of.

4. Can you explain the scriptural basis for the Mission Prayer?

Ezekiel 37:1-14 describes the vision of dry bones, where the Lord commands the prophet to prophesy over them, leading to an extraordinary event. Many passages refer to a "strong headed people", such as Exodus 33:5, where the Lord speaks to Moses about the sons of Israel. Jesus himself speaks of "detached branches" in John 15:11. He is the vine, we are the branches.

Hence the proposal that throughout the Cluster, the approach to the preparation of our parish children for First Holy Communion and Confirmation should change so that:
  - a. It is a partnership between school, home and parish not just a matter for our parish primary schools;
  - b. There will no longer be a set date when all the children in a particular cohort will receive the sacraments;
  - c. Children will be more intensively prepared for the sacraments alongside their parents and will receive either First Holy Communion or Confirmation only when they and their parents are specifically ready.

The next General Meeting of the Cluster will be held on 22<sup>nd</sup> September 2024 at 4 pm in the same venue.
