Fr. Simon writes: At the conclusion of the season of light, 40 days after Christmas, we celebrate the day Jesus was presented in the temple; hence: "The Presentation of the Lord". There will need to be a discussion at the next Parish Pastoral Council meeting about the best long-term solution in the circumstances.

Reorganisation of our ministry of Holy Communion to the sick and housebound: we will need to integrate this absolutely vital ministry across the Cluster and this will inevitably require new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC) to be commissioned. We know that there many people either at home or in care homes whom we need to visit. **Please pray about this. Is God calling you to this ministry?** All existing and any potential new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are requested to attend a meeting on **Wednesday 11th February 2026 at 7.30 pm** in the Guild Room to address the following: reminder of the nature of the Ministry both in Mass and outside Mass; what the Church expects of Ministers from the *moment they receive the Sacrament to take out to the sick and house bound; discussion about current practice with a view to establish a single best practice throughout the Cluster; allocation of responsibilities*. Please make every effort to attend this. The experience of existing Extraordinary Ministers will be valuable contribution to the meeting. All Extraordinary Ministers (current and new) will be commissioned afresh on Holy Thursday at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper (**Thursday, 2nd April**).

Reorganisation of the preparation of our parish children for the sacraments of initiation: The Sacraments of Initiation are: Baptism, Eucharist (First Holy Communion) and Confirmation. A person needs all three in order to become a full member of the family of the Catholic Church. We would like to thank all the families who are waiting for further information about baptism preparation for the patience whilst we gradually get ourselves organised in the new structure. **All parents wishing to present children for baptism are invited to come to a meeting on Saturday 14th February at 10.30 am.** We also need to start getting information to the parents of children preparing for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. However, before we can do any of that we need to review how this important subject has been dealt with over the past two years, make changes where necessary and establish a best practice across the Cluster. To that end, fr. Simon is inviting all interested parties to a day on evangelisation, initiation and the sacraments which the Newman Cluster of parishes (Christ the King, Our Lady of the Assumption & St Margaret Mary) will be having on **Saturday, 21 February in the Newman Gallery at SMM beginning at 10 am aiming to finish at 2 pm**. The guest speaker will be Fr Sean Gough who is the parish priest at the Divine Mercy Cluster of parishes at Chelmsley Wood. Merger Consultation – Next Meeting: There will be a meeting in the Maryvale Community Centre, Old Oscott Hill B44 9SP on **Saturday 7th February 2026 at 3 pm** to consider issues raised in the September consultation specifically about that area of the Cluster. Anybody in the Cluster is welcome to attend whether they worship regularly at OLAM or not. The meeting will be chaired by Graham Green (Vice-Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council). Jackie Scott (the Chair of the Merger Advisory Group) will be present and address the meeting. Deacon Gary will also address the meeting. Wendy Gasson will take minutes.

Quick Recap

- The September Consultation across CTK and OLAM received 375 replies and numerous comments by way of feedback. Of those replies two thirds came from CTK and one third from OLAM. What was then the 10.00 Sunday morning Mass at CTK accounted for 50% of all the replies just on its own.
- With varying degrees of enthusiasm, it seems now to be generally accepted that there must be a merger by fusing the two parishes of CTK and OLAM so that resources, human and otherwise, can be shared to everybody's benefit.
- When CTK and OLAM are fused into one parish, the new parish must have a new name. "Parish" here does NOT mean the building in which we worship but the community that comes together to worship in whatever buildings we have. A new name marks a fresh start in that community's mission to live out and spread the Gospel. The new name does not require the schools to change their name. The buildings which serve as our places of worship will not be changing their name either.
- The Parish Council, following a suggestion from the Merger Advisory Group, agreed that two names be put forward to you for consideration. Those names were: (1) St. John Henry Newman and the Sacred Heart and (2) Blessed Dominic Barberi. "Saint John Henry Newman and Sacred Heart" was overwhelmingly more popular but there were a number of comments indicating that the choice was too narrow and that whilst St John Henry Newman and the Sacred Heart captured the rich history of Maryvale, other parishes with similar names were close by and it was, being frank, a bit of a mouthful. The Merger Advisory Group recognises that we need a second look at that aspect of the merger.
- The other major matter in the September consultation was the question of the future of the current OLAM Church. The issue there is: can the building be repurposed or should we move down the hill to use the Sacred Heart Chapel at the Maryvale Institute or find some other place of worship. Since September, work has been going on behind the scenes to examine a proposal from Cardinal Wiseman school that they buy the building from the Parish and convert it into a 6th Form Centre with the parish using what would then be a school chapel for Mass at weekends.

Where are we now?

- Amongst the various issues considered in the Merger Document (on the websites) was that of Mass times. We no longer need to consult on that because the new schedule has been fixed following Fr. Thé's departure for Taiwan.
- There will be a second consultation specifically about new parish name on 7th/8th March. There will be a list of names at all three of our places of worship for which you can vote. The aim is to draw up a short list of 3-5 names which we can submit to Archbishop Bernard. He has the ultimate decision. Parish names have to have "a sacred designation", i.e. a saint's name. Names referring to Council Wards or postcodes are not allowed (Rome's rules).
- After careful investigation, the Cardinal Wiseman proposal is not feasible. This will be a disappointment to many but unfortunately it is a no go.

What will be discussed on Saturday 7th February?

- There will be a fuller explanation of why the Cardinal Wiseman proposal cannot happen and what other options there are for providing an appropriate place of worship on the Maryvale side of the parish.
- In view of some of the comments on the feedback, the way Diocesan Finances work, who is responsible for building repairs and what happens to the money if parish buildings are sold needs to be thoroughly explained.
- There is clearly also some concern about the place of OLAM within the Cluster so that will have to be discussed as well.

How will the meeting be run?

- The meeting will start at 3 pm with prayer. After some introductory comments from the three members of the panel, there will be an opportunity for small group discussion. We will have a tea break somewhere around 3.45/4.00 pm. Then there will be feedback from the groups and any final questions. The meeting will close with prayer at 5 pm.
- There will be an opportunity to join with Deacon Gary in Evening Prayer at 5.15 pm.

After Saturday's meeting, what next?

- There will be a report to the Parish Pastoral Council when it next meets on 10th February.
- There will be the consultation on names on 7th/8th March – see above.
- The draft Petition for Merger which must be submitted to the Archdiocese will be available for comment after all Masses on the weekend of 21st/22nd March and before the evening Mass of the Annunciation on 25th March.
- The aim is to submit the petition as soon as possible after Easter Sunday.
